SWIPE CARDS SHOULD BE USED BY ALL CLIENTS

Several years ago we moved away from handwriting meal signatures to swipe cards for the purpose of accuracy and speed. Many times we cannot read the handwritten signatures and it makes it impossible to get the signatures put into the computer so the meals can be counted.

The clipboard at the front desk is for new people coming in for the first time, for guests of our clients and anyone under age 60 who would not have a card. Everyone else is expected to use the swipe card we make for you with your personal identification number on it.

You keep up with your drivers license, bank and credit cards, so surely you can keep up with your meal swipe card.

MILK AND FOOD FROM CONGREGATE MEALS CANNOT BE TAKEN OUT OF THE BUILDING

The Center receives a little federal funds as a subsidy toward the cost of the meal, so when we get their money we have to follow their rules. Simply, cartons of milk and food cannot be taken out of the building when you have gotten a congregate meal. You are welcome to drink one milk with your lunch, but it cannot go home with you. This is not our rules, this is a mandate from our program.

Remember, you are not 'paying' for the meal, you are contributing toward the actual cost of the meal. Your \$4 contribution toward the actual cost of the meal is vital to this program.

As a reminder, chocolate and white milk is sold at all local grocery stores for your at-home use. 😊
